"It's so exciting and rewarding to work with CHOP as they expand their volunteering initiatives," Markel commented. "We look forward to helping many families in the Philadelphia area over the coming years."

The Homeless Health Initiative, started in 1989, is a volunteer outreach program coordinated by Karen Hudson, Melissa Bennett, and Melissa Berrios. Under their leadership, Children's Hospital volunteers provide free, high-quality medical, nursing and dental care as well as health education workshops in area shelters. The Homeless Health Initiative also helps families access important long-term health care services including health insurance, primary care and specialty care.
